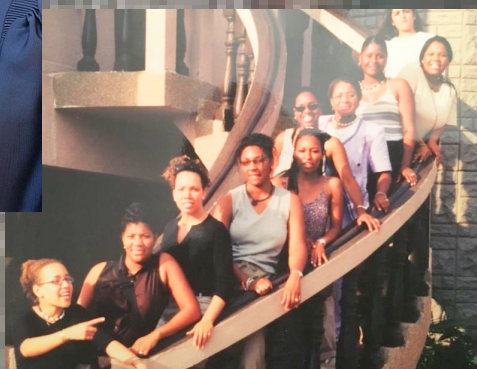

Dr. Smith completed her undergraduate degree at the University of South Alabama (USA). She began her public health career at the USA Center for Health Communities, where she was not only my special assistant but also became the Community Health Outreach Coordinator. Notably, she designed the first lay health advisor curriculum at the Center, resulting in the first fully implemented and certified program offered by the USA.

Dr. Smith later transitioned to the Mobile County Health Department and became a senior director of clinical administration, leading primary care clinics focused on treating adults and women and the county’s Ryan White (domestic HIV) program. After receiving a fellowship with the American Public Health Association and Brookings Institution, she worked with the United States Senate Committee on the Budget and Health, Education, Labor, and Pensions Committee, where she spearheaded a multi-prong approach to addressing Rx opioid abuse. After Washington, Dr. Smith has spent nearly nine years at CDC. She earned her Doctorate in Education, Leadership, Policy, and Law from Alabama State University in Montgomery, Alabama, and a Master of Public Administration and Bachelor of Science in Biomedical Science from the University of South Alabama.

Jake, a proud resident of the City of Pittsburgh, is as a recognized United States Marine combat veteran of Operation Desert Storm, who received the Combat Action Ribbon, National Defense Service Medal, and the Kuwaiti Liberation Medal. In January 2022, he accepted the 61st Mayor of Pittsburgh’s appointment to become Chief of Staff, leaving his position as State Representative of the 19th Legislative District, where he served for 19 years. As Chief of Staff, Jake leads the charge in actualizing Mayor Gainey’s vision of a “Pittsburgh for All.”

Before joining Mayor Gainey’s Administration, Jake was the longest-serving African American member of the State House of Representatives. During his time in the State House, Jake also served as the first African American Chair for the House Professional Licensure Committee, which oversees the 29 professional boards and commissions that set the standards and practices of our workforce. He was only the second member selected to serve on the powerful Appropriations Committee as a first-term legislator. Jake holds a bachelor’s degree in political science from North Carolina Agricultural and Technical State University, where he graduated with honors. He has a Master of Public Administration from the University of Pittsburgh.
